

University Senior College Academic Achievement Overview

2016

- Dux of School was Son Cao (Sonny) Tran with an ATAR of 99.95 and Merits in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Research Project.
- Proximae Accessit was Andrew Makestas with 99.8. Merits in Mathematical Studies, Biology, Physics and Research Project.
- Sonny Tran and Lilly Deluca both received Governor of South Australia Commendation for 2016.
- There were a total of 53 A+ awarded across the cohort including 44 Merits
- 10 Students were in the top 1% of the nation with an ATAR above 99:
- 36 students secured an ATAR above 95, placing them in the top 5% of the nation.
- 73 students secured an ATAR above 90, placing them in the top 10% of the nation.

2015

- Dux of School was Lyman Lin and Nathan Swincer was Proximae Accessit.
- 14 students secured an ATAR above 99 placing them in the top 1% of candidates across Australia:
- A total of 31 Merits and 42 A+ grade were awarded to members of the 2015 Year 12 cohort in university preferred subjects
- 90% of USC students received their first preference offer to university.
 - o 95 (61%) students were offered places to the University of Adelaide
 - 32 (21%) to the University of SA
 - 24 (15%) to Flinders University

2014

- Dux of School was Kate Walsh and Proximae Accessit was Phoebe Smith
- 12 students secured an ATAR above 99 placing them in the top 1% of SACE candidates in Australia
- A total of 27 Merits and 40 A+ grade were awarded across the cohort
- 90% of USC students received their first preference offer to university.
 - o 85 (61%) students were offered places to the University of Adelaide
 - o 38 (27%) to the University of SA
 - o 15 (11%) to Flinders University

2013

- Dux of School was Sean Liew and Zoe Brown was Proximae Accessit.
- Andrew Henderson was awarded a Governor of South Australia Commendation for 2013.
- 18 students secured an ATAR above 99
- A total of 35 Merits and 54 A+ grades were awarded
- 92% percent of USC students received their first preference offer to university.
 - 97 (64%) students were offered places to the University of Adelaide
 - o 30 (20%) to the University of SA
 - o 20 (13%) to Flinders University

2012

- Dux of School was Julia Conway and Anastassia Silaeva was Proximae Accessit.
- 10 students received an ATAR above 99
- 74 students secured an ATAR above 90
- In total 36 Merits were secured in university preferred subjects across the cohort.
- 94% percent of USC students received their first preference offer to university.
 - o 107 (65%) students were offered places to the University of Adelaide,
 - o 25 (15%) to the University of SA
 - o 18 (11%) to Flinders University.

2011

- Dux of School was shared between John Connell and Charlotte Pascoe-Purvis while May Huynh was Proximae Accessit.
- 5 were placed amongst the academic elite in Australia and secured an ATAR ranking of 99.95.
- 11 students received an ATAR above 99
- 96 students secured an ATAR above 90.
- 36 Merits were secured in university preferred subjects across the cohort
- John Connell, May Huynh, John Makestas, Tam Nguyen and Charlotte Pascoe-Purvis were each awarded a prestigious University of Adelaide Vice Chancellor's Scholarship. USC students secured 5 of the 35 Vice Chancellor's scholarships awarded.
- 94% of USC students received their first preference offer to university.
 - o 107 students were offered places at the University of Adelaide,
 - o 54 at the University of SA
 - o 35 at Flinders University.

2010

- Robert Dickinson was Dux of School and Catlin Langford was Proximae Accessit.
- 3 students were placed amongst the academic elite with an ATAR of 99.95;
- 21 received an ATAR above 99
- 79 students secured an ATAR above 90
- A total of 49 Merits were secured across the cohort
- Robert Dickinson was awarded a Vice Chancellor's Scholarship and a Principal's Scholarship.
- 82 students were offered places to the University of Adelaide,
- 54 to the University of SA
- 39 to Flinders University
